Experience in capacity building & facilitation of learning in MEL

Órla specialises in supporting organisations to develop and implement their own M&E systems, by providing consultancy, facilitation and training. Recent clients in the area of capacity building include:

- **Comic Relief's 'Girls in Gangs'** project. I co-lead a team of five **Learning Co-ordinators**, in partnership with Southern Hemisphere Consultants, South Africa. I have direct responsibility for 2 UK projects (providing consultancy on M&E challenges), and I also provide co-facilitation of learning (online and face to face) across all projects (UK, Colombia, South Africa) over 3 years. This initiative is provided by Comic

Relief to support the development of M&E capacity in their grantees. Most recently, I facilitated the development of a cross-project theory of change.

- **DFID/ Institute of Development Studies** AURA project (African Universities Research Approaches (AURA) Capacity Development Programme (my role was particularly focused on **diagnostic** development for pedagogic and research capacity, and facilitating a needs assessment with the Kenya partner, Kenyatta University)

This report identified issues in developing and maintaining high quality and useful research in this field. The document was disseminated widely, and provided the focus for a 1

day workshop for key members of the Sport for Development field. Feedback on this report emphasised the usefulness of report. The community welcomed the practical suggestions for improving standards in this area, and I regularly receive requests for copies of this document – it was referred to recently at a meeting of Commonwealth Ministers for Sport.
